ZOOM, Inflation & Interest Rates

For the first time in what seems like a long time, life is starting to feel normal again! I am starting to see crowds gather again. That is pretty exciting after 14 months of social distancing, face masks, and virtual meetings! I am looking forward to going to the movies again with my family.

I feel sure that virtual meetings are here to stay and why not? It is a great way of communicating with a much more personal feel than a phone call or email. It also saves enormous amounts of time as well as money. No reason to get in the car and drive 20 minutes to an hour each way when you can just hop on a virtual meeting!



We did go almost exclusively to virtual meetings in 2020. So it's been a while since I have seen many of you in person! <u>I am really looking forward to seeing everyone in person.</u> We do believe virtual meetings have actually given us the ability to increase our level of service to our clientele and we will continue using "Zoom" meetings. But we also love to see everyone in person.

So why are interest rates and inflation in the news?

The 10-year Treasury yield on May 28th, 2021 was 1.58% according to the US Department of the Treasury website. This is down from the 1.74% yield on March 31st of this year. We started the year at .93%, that's quite a move.

We started 2020 with a 10-year yield of 1.92% on the 10-year and we dipped as low as .36% on August the 4th. So you could have bought a 10-year treasury bond and made a whopping .36% per year for 10 years! Not much of a deal. Remember, as the yield on treasuries moves up the price of treasuries as well as many other bonds move down. This has caused much of the bond market to move down. Within the last 9 months, the 10-year treasury yield has risen from .36% to 1.58%.

Inflation is back! The Consumer Price Index increased .8% in April and .6% in March. Over the last 12 months, the rate is 4.2%.

Gasoline up 49.6% in last year


Used cars up 10% alone in April, largest one month increase since 1953 when tracking began

Copper has doubled in the last year


